From the Pastor's Desk

Alleluia!

Christ is Risen!

Now what?

After an amazing Easter morning, full of beautiful music, celebrating, and surprises, the early church sat back and wondered, "now what?" Jesus had beaten death. He had made good on His promises. Now it was time for those who loved him, and those who were curious about him, to figure out what to do next?

They met in each other's homes. They gathered to pray. They studied the holy words of their tradition, and they told stories about Jesus. They told stories about how he had changed their lives and how his resurrection had changed everything! They talked about the healing they had experienced. They discussed the peace they felt when they relied on his Spirit to be with them during difficult times. They spread the word to family and friends about the exciting things that they had witnessed. In all of this, they refined for themselves what it meant to be part of this new thing.

In this post Easter season I believe that we have similar opportunities.

Jesus has been an integral part of our lives this past season of Lent.

- We have gathered in his name on Sunday mornings and witnessed new and old friends worshiping with us.
- We have heard the sweet "hosannas" of our choir as they have lifted up their voices in praise each week.
- We have come together in Bible studies and prayer groups.
- We have prayed for one another through our personal and communal Holy weeks.
- We have met in homes and at the Village Market where we have told about the activity of Christ's spirit alive in our congregation.

Now it is time for us to refine what we mean when we say that we are part of this thing called *Federated Community Church*.

- How does it make a difference that we are here?
- How have you seen Christ's spirit changing peoples lives within and beyond our congregation?
- What are we inviting people into when we say, "join us at FCC"?

I can assure you that just as the early church found, there is not one, perfect, universal answer to those questions. The solution will be an evolving one. It will change with every person who comes or goes forth from this community of faith. It will change with new understandings and experiences of Jesus. It will change as we change. It is important that we keep track of the answers though, in every time we ask the questions. Who knows, perhaps *this* will be the place for them to do that very exciting work of the spirit!

The Men's breakfast Group recently voted to have a Granit brick placed on the Walk of Honor at the Mass. Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Agawam, Ma. in honor of his service during World War II. The walkway is located around the center core of the cemetery. If you happen to attend a service at the cemetery in the future walk out to the flag pole and will see the walkway on the right.

Big E Fund Raiser Sept 12th- 28th

Our church has received an invitation to work at the Agawam Lions Club Chicken Dinner booth at the Big E. We would share \$5,200.00 with The Agawam Congregational Church. The two churches would receive \$2,600.00 each.

Individuals working will be given a pass to the Big E as well a parking voucher.

The hours of work will be 8 PM to 10 PM each day with a total staffing requirement of 6 people between the 2 churches. The task involves: cleaning the Barbeque Pit, Dining Room, Serving Line Area and Kitchen. You will be working in teams of 2 with the Agawam Church staff under the supervision of a Lions Club Member.

We need to fill a total of 52 time slots during the event. [That does not mean we need 52 people, as each person could work more than one time slot].

In order to plan ahead we must come up with a list of people that are interested in this fund raiser by the end of May to show that we can make this commitment. Once we have determined that we have enough people, we will assign the actual dates for each person to work based on their availability. This commitment schedule must be submitted to the Lions Club by July 1st.

We have a budget figure to raise \$10,000.00 in 2014. Making \$2,600.00 for this one event go a long way in achieving this commitment for the year. There will be a signup sheet in Libby Hall starting on Sunday May 4th

Hope you will be able to work at this event.
