Elsewhere and in this newsletter you will find details of exactly what would be helpful; specific food items and requests for volunteer help to name a few acute needs. Monetary contributions are always welcome. Further, we will be sharing some ways in which you can join us in helping the Hampden Senior Center provide a Thanksgiving Day meal.

Lastly please join us in prayer in this mission. Whatever you are able to contribute - food, prayer, time or money, please join us in helping to feed Jesus.

The Church recently received a bequeath from the estate of Melba Chapin, an 83 yr. member of our church. The church greatly appreciates Melba's dedication and service to the church when she lived and is grateful for this continued commitment on her death. Melba's will specified that \$15,000 be used to create the Melba R. Chapin and Wesley A. Chapin Scholarship Fund and \$5,000 was also designated for the Music Endowment Fund and \$10,000 for any purpose the Church felt was necessary. Additionally, we also received \$20,000 from Melba's niece that was put into the General Fund to use at our discretion.

The church greatly appreciates these gifts as they are much needed, especially in times of annual budget shortfalls.

Community Survival Center

The mission of the Community Survival Center is to provide survival items of food, clothing, and household goods to members of our community in times of need.

The Community Survival Center is a 30 year old non-profit agency that helps families struggling to provide the basics: food, clothing and household items. Our emergency food pantry serves Ludlow, Wilbraham, and Hampden as well as the 16 Acres, Pine Point and Indian Orchard neighborhoods in Springfield.

The Bridge of Hope Thrift Shop is open to the public and sells quality clothing and accessories, most at just \$2 per item. Also, the Clothing and Household Goods Program offers sales at just \$3/bag and is also open to the general public. All proceeds help to fund the pantry.

They are supported by donations from neighbors: individuals, churches, businesses, schools and various groups and organizations within the above mentioned communities. And they are extremely grateful to be able to support the center primarily with their help.

From now until the end of the year they will be concentrating on holiday foods that they bag into complete meals to be cooked at home by the recipients

Important update from the Pastoral Search Committee:

As members of the Search Committee, we want to express our continuing gratitude for the trust you have placed in us. We have been working closely with Rev. Jill Graham, our UCC Associate Conference Minister, and Rev. Heidi Chamberland, our United Methodist District Superintendent.

The entire Search and Call process has been outlined in open church meetings and in newsletters; at this time, we would like to share with you where we currently are in this process:

1. **UCC Candidates:** Persons who have been authorized to complete a UCC Ministerial Profile have been submitting profiles for our committee through the Conference/Association office. The Ministerial Profile includes information about the candidate's educational background, experience, a detailed faith statement, eight written references, a background check form, and a criminal background check.

UMeth. Candidates are referred by Rev. Heidi Chamberland after prayerful consideration with her committee.

2. As a group, we review, discuss, and pray about all candidates. We follow up with persons in whom we have particular interest. *These are persons who seem to fit well with our church's "personality" and faith vision, as revealed through our visioning meetings, church survey, and ongoing conversations within our church family.*

The follow up for UCC candidates includes telephone reference checks, telephone interviews, and reviewing a candidate's sermon tapes, sermon postings on the internet, as well as the website, Facebook page, and newsletters of their particular churches. Many candidates have their own websites, Facebook pages, and/or blogs, affording us a clearer understanding of the theology, ministry, and personality of each candidate.

While pursuing these steps, we also continue to evaluate new Ministerial Profiles.

3. At this point, we have selected a small number of UCC candidates for personal interviews, and have forwarded our Church Profile to them.

Following these interviews, we will make arrangements for our Search Committee members to worship with each individual in a "neutral pulpit", a church setting arranged by our Conference/Association office.

4. We will invite one or two candidates back for second interviews, following which we will seek God's guidance and prayerfully make a decision on a candidate.

5. If the candidate we recommend chooses to accept, compensation arrangements will be clarified, and a date for a "candidating Sunday" will be established.

6. You will have an opportunity to meet the candidate (and family) that weekend in an informal setting as well as the formal worship service in which the candidate will preach.

A congregational meeting following the worship service (the candidate will not be there) will offer each member an opportunity to ask questions of the Search Committee, and to vote on the Call to our new pastor.

We are grateful during this time for the faithful interim leadership of Pastor Jan.


We profoundly trust that God will guide both our candidates and the members of our Search Committee. We ask you to pray for us regularly.
