From the Pastor's Desk

While standing guard on the watchtower, I waited for the LORD's answer, before explaining the reason for my complaint. Then the LORD told me: "I will give you my message in the form of a vision. Write it clearly enough to be read at a glance. At the time I have decided, my words will come true. You can trust what I say about the future. It may take a long time but keep on waiting— it will happen! "I, the LORD, refuse to accept anyone who is proud. Only those who live by faith are acceptable to me."

Habakkuk 2: 1-4

The questions of "why" are as old as the prophets. Habakkuk questioned the Lord's silence when he prayed. He cried out to the Lord about the awful injustices that were taking place and why was the Lord allowing those injustices to continue. (This is not unlike our many cries today.) The Lord answers Habakkuk and shares with him what is happening and will happen: telling Habakkuk to watch. God says Habakkuk would not believe even if God explained it all to him. Habakkuk continues to question the Lord with **why** God is choosing to act and allow life to play out as described. The Lord answers Habakkuk again that God's words will come true, to trust in God's words. It may take a long time but keep trusting and having faith Only those who are not proud and live by faith are acceptable to God.

Our question why and how God is doing something is our own desire to want to be in control and our search to understand and want to know more about God. To understand God, we need to look at Jesus Christ, the second part of the Trinity. Jesus didn't

come as a dictator, but as a humble man, who walked in love and faith even through much difficulty. God tells us that God's ways may take a long time but we, as disciples, are called to be faithful.

Many times, tragedy and turmoil bring humans to search for God. When the questions of "Why?" are not answered or the prayers are not answered how we demand, then many folks give up on God. But God calls us to humility and faithfulness.

Humility acknowledges that all we are and all we have are not ours alone, but God's. It is all a gift from God. S/He oversees the entire world and yet, since we are made in the image of God and filled with the Holy Spirit, we are connected to God, so God knows our individuals needs and desires, as well as the pain we suffer. God understands out questions of "Why?" We are not alone, we are not in charge of the world, we do not understand the big picture: but we are called to have faith.

God told Habakkuk it may take a long time for God's promises to be fulfilled but it will happen. We are called to be faithful because that is what is important to God. We need to be trusting even when we do not understand. God is still in charge. Listen, watch, and wait and keep faith that will carry you through onto eternity.

I share with you The Statement of Faith from the United Church of Canada found in the Methodist Hymnal (#883). We have been reciting and affirming this statement in our weekly summer worship. It declares our faith beliefs and brings me much comfort. I hope it does the same for you.

We are not alone, we live in God's world.
We believe in God:
who has created and is creating,
who has come in Jesus, the Word made flesh,
to reconcile and make new,
who works in us and others by the Spirit.
We trust in God.
We are called to be the church:
to celebrate God's presence,
to love and serve others,

to seek justice and resist evil, to proclaim Jesus, crucified and risen, our judge and our hope. In life, in death, in life beyond death, God is with us. We are not alone. Thanks be to God. Amen.

We may not understand but God is with us and will move us into His/Her vision for the world. Take comfort, we are never alone!

Are we listening for God's call? Loud or soft, God calls us daily.

Loud and Clear by Vince Amlin

"The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out ... and the sheep follow him because they know his voice." - John 10:2-4 excerpts (NRSV)

The first thing my daughter told me about her new teacher was how tall he is. "Taller than you, Daddy."

The second thing was how loud.

"When recess is over, he yells, 'TEEEEAM OOOOOH SIIIIIIIX!" She made her voice as low as she could as she imitated his call.

How do the sheep know the shepherd's voice? Maybe they're born knowing. But I suspect it helps to learn what to listen for.

At one of the churches I serve, Gilead, each week two people get up and share a true story from their lives about anything at all. And when they finish we say, "The word of God for the people of God. Thanks be to God."

The response reminds me to listen closely for the shepherd. God's name is rarely mentioned in the stories. But God's voice is all over the place if I'm paying attention.

The hope is that, by practicing, we'll recognize it more easily. In other people's stories. And our own.

A couple days after my daughter told me about her teacher, I was praying in the sanctuary of the other church I serve, Bethany.

I had tuned out the sound of the playground across the street. Until I heard a deep voice bellow, "TEEEEAM OOOOOH SIIIIIIIX!"

And even though I had never heard him speak myself, I knew just whose voice it was. Loud and low (and tall).
