From the Pastor's Desk

"I (Paul) therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all". Ephesians 4: 1-6 ESV

Greetings of Grace and Peace! Easter Blessings upon you!

Who would have thought a year ago that we would still be struggling with coronavirus? It has been a difficult, sad, stressful year. I ponder what God is saying to us during this time. Now I want to be clear that I do not believe God oversees sending down a virus or other catastrophe upon us, but God does allow humanity to have free will and to pay the consequences of our actions, both in our personal lives and as a collective. What I do believe God might be saying is *enough with division: you are all my children*.

We are becoming more aware of how small the world is and how interrelated we all are. While we are divided by countries, governments, philosophies, religions, customs, and more; the bottom line is *we are one*. We are human beings who live in different places with different customs and ways of living and of honoring God, even calling God by a wide variety of names; but we are all brothers and sisters who are made in the image of God and surrounded and filled with the Holy Spirit. The coronavirus

has impacted everyone! We are in this together: every country, every culture, nationality, and religion. Every economy, every hospital and staff has been affected. Every school system, every family, every business, every human is affected. We are one in our struggle against this virus.

Is God speaking to us and allowing us to see how connected we all are with the many issues coming up in the same time period: effects of climate change, racial injustices, coronavirus, and even the cargo boat blocking the Suez Canal, which will impact all of us with material goods. Has God gotten your attention in all this also?

So, then what can we do about it? None of us can solve the entire world's problems, but we can and should do our part. Be mindful of how we treat one another. Do only words come out of our mouths for building up others? We can and should speak the truth, but do it with gentleness and love, and a willingness to join in and help make it better going forward. Can we carpool more often or walk instead of using the car? take more local vacation trips instead of flying - which impacts the climate? Might we cut down on our consumption of meat, one, two or three days a week, to lessen the demands on our environment? Can we examine our own prejudice and biases honestly? Can we pray for our world leaders and our brothers and sisters all over the world? Can we share our resources including our time? Talents? Treasure? Prayers? Visit? Mission Trip?

We are Easter people. We are people called to have Hope. We are to look, see, and name reality but to know that God is still working and to offer ourselves to be used to God's glory. We are not to gloss over reality with a thin sugar-coated quick fix but to look honestly at the situation and ourselves and work **with** God in whatever and however God asks us to serve. While the situations may seem daunting, we have hope that God sees the entire picture and asks us to be used in the solutions. How will you respond?

May this season of Easter be a blessing and may you see the Risen Christ surprising you as you journey. Keep your eyes open!




Memorial Service for Peg Stearns

<u>Safety Guidelines for Indoor</u> <u>Worship</u>



As we open our doors and begin to worship physically together, it is important that we continue to follow church guidelines.

Please continue to wear a face mask and make sure to stay 6' apart. We have pews marked and an overflow area set up in the Isham Room. Face masks should cover your mouth and nose at all times while in church, unless speaking from the podium.

If you or any member of the family are experiencing the following symptoms, please do not attend in person, but consider watching on Facebook Live or "Goto Meeting" at the scheduled viewing time. You can also view the service later on cable tv or on our Facebook page or FCC website at a more convenient time for you.

If you are experiencing any symptoms such as fever (100.0 and above) or chills, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, fatigue, headache, muscle/body aches, runny nose/congestion, new loss of taste or smell, or nausea, vomiting or diarrhea, please stay home. Also, if you have had "close contact" with an individual diagnosed with COVID-19. "Close contact" means living in the same household as a person who has tested positive for COVID-19, caring for a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 being within 6 feet of a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 for 15 minutes or more, or coming in direct contact with secretions (e.g., sharing utensils, being coughed on) from a person who has tested positive for COVID-19, while that person was symptomatic; or if you have been asked to self-isolate or quarantine by your doctor or a local public health official; please stay home and watch services as described above.

We will ask that you sign in at worship to stay in guidelines for contact tracing, should there be a need.

Please note no communal gatherings pre or post service (e.g., coffee hours or other food services) are allowed.
