### From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings in the Name of Christ!

Summer is upon us! My heart is filled with joy: seeing the beauty in the green leaves that fill the sky lines and provide shade in our yards, the colors of flowers landscaping houses and roadways, and seeing more folks out and about walking neighborhoods and play areas. Here at FCC, we are back gathering outside under the shade of the large maple tree for Sunday worship at 10 AM. As we worship, one can hear running water in the background, watch and hear birds in their natural environment, sing our hearts out about God's amazing love and grace, and listen to the prayers and sermon.

Leading worship, especially preaching a sermon, is often a tricky balance. The pastor's role is complicated. Pastors are not here simply to make everyone happy but to challenge each to become the best person they were created to be. Pastors are called to be scriptural and show how the Word applies to our lives' situations. Pastors in their preaching are called to teach, shepherd, and challenge.

As teachers, we share how Jesus lived, the culture of his time (Bible study offers more in depth about this), what he taught, and how he calls his disciples to live out in their day-to-day living. We come to church to be reminded of the ways of Jesus, admit where we have failed (for many of us: AGAIN), and be challenged to live out our love in actions of spiritual disciplines: Bible study, fasting, private devotions, prayer groups, serving and mission work. We leave worship knowing that we are loved by God and a community, forgiven and restored to begin anew.

As shepherds, Pastors preach and lift each person who comes to worship. It is a difficult world we live in. There are many demands in our personal lives, violence that invades our streets, stresses of illness, loneliness, money, divorce, and more. It is easy to feel defeated and alone. For those who come to worship, Pastors lift them up, reminding each that they are a Beloved child of God. No one is too far gone, too bad a sinner (whatever the sin might be) for Jesus to forgive and restore. Jesus, the Good Shepherd, leaves the flock and searches for the one who is lost. (John 10) Parishioners leave the service filled with joy, hope, and love. We are built up. We feel the Pastor has done a good job.

These first two roles of preaching are easy for Pastors to preach. They make everyone feel good. Worshippers leave the service happy. However, the Pastor is called by God to challenge and have a prophetic voice also. The late Reinhold Niebuhr, theologian, ethicist, author, professor, and more, has a famous quote regarding pastors' preaching roles: "comfort the afflicted and afflict the comfortable."\* The Pastor is called to challenge the folks in the pew (or those who listen on TV or social media). Disciples of Christ are called to be active in social justice issues: to be educated about them and to be challenged into working to make God's Kin-dom come here on earth. Many of us do not like to be challenged. But it is the call of God to the Pastor to look at what is happening in our world and point out injustices as we strive to make the world a better place for all. When you hear a sermon that makes you feel upset, one should not lash out at the Pastor, but first discern in prayer exactly what is making you upset. In prayer, journaling, or discussion, one can learn more about differences regarding various issues, about one's own thoughts and beliefs, and strive to hear what God is saying and where Jesus might stand on the matter. Growing in knowledge and understanding is key to maturing as a disciple. Another quote by Niebuhr is: "*Ultimately* evil is done not so much by evil people, but by good people who do not know themselves and who do not probe deeply."\* So, let us grow in Christ by learning, thinking, reflection, and discussion.

# Connecting in the Spirit Our Church and Our Community

To grow we will be . . .

- \* Purchasing a new computer and software Cost \$1,195.00 This is a Capital expense that will be paid for by the Judith and Arthur Gerrish bequeath.
- \* Ministry Architects is a church consulting company that will be guiding us by 2 contracts, the 1<sup>st</sup> will provide . . .

Ministry Architects delivers the following results to Federated Community Church

- **1.** A two-day virtual assessment of the children's ministry identifying assets and challenges, resulting in recommendations and a 12-months timeline.
- **2.** A one-year teaching calendar, developing a curriculum plan for the children's ministry.
- **3.** The creation of a Renovation Team which supports the ministry by leading a culture shift, engaging and equipping volunteers, and overseeing implementation of a new one-year teaching calendar.

- **4.** Chairing the Renovation Team for 6-months, which includes ongoing coaching for the Christian education leaders, assuring all recommendations from the first six months of the assessment report have been addressed.
- **5.** A volunteer development plan, resulting in systems for volunteer recruitment and training, volunteer job descriptions for all staff and volunteer positions, and a long-term staffing plan.
- **6.** Executive coaching for the children's ministry leaders for 6-months.
- 7. Updating or creating the following compliance documents:
- Safe Sanctuary Policies & Procedures
- Children's Ministry Leadership Covenant of Expectations
- Christian Education Background Check and Application
- **8.** A game plan for launching quarterly momentum-building outreach events.

In the option above, Ministry Architects takes full responsibility for leading the Renovation Team, and at the same time, trains the Renovation Team in how to do the work. Coaching is provided throughout the 6 months of the contract to the children's ministry Leaders. Ministry Architects ensures all recommendations for the first 6 months in the assessment report are addressed.

### Their 2<sup>nd</sup> contract is a Volunteer Accelerator

Ministry Architects delivers the Volunteer Accelerator, a customized online tool that will:

- 1. Help members of the church community identify their skills and passions via a short online questionnaire
- 2. Use the questionnaire answers to immediately recommend the volunteer positions at Federated Community Church that are the best fit for each individual participant
- 3. Initiate a conversation between the volunteer and appropriate church leaders about how and where to volunteer
- 4. Create a database for staff that identifies potential volunteers with specific skills and gifts
- 5. Provide an easy-to-read overview of the talents and passions that are prevalent at the church
- 6. Allow for editing over time and retain the church's data privately and securely, year after year With the Volunteer

Accelerator, Ministry Architects works with church staff to complete the following:

- Identify the list of volunteer positions
- Develop a list of characteristics that are important to the success of each position
- Customize the language of a 20 to 25 question online volunteer questionnaire
- Test and fine-tune the custom questionnaire and positions' attributes in order to maximize the tool's matching accuracy
- Launch the system online
- Introduce the process at a congregational event or worship service
- Provide annual re-evaluation and editing of the online tool\*

These 2 programs will cost \$8,965.00 and \$1,550.00 = \$10,515.00 This will be paid by:

- Methodist Foundation Grants (#2499)	-\$2200.00
-Together for Tomorrow	-\$2950.00
- Larson Fund	-\$4000.00
- Christian Education Programs (#2520)	-\$3,000.00
- Helen Dickinson Bequest (#1136)	-\$2,365.00

\* Bell, Chimes and Mallets! We are very excited about the newly formed bell choir. We were very fortunate to receive our bell set at no cost. The cost for a new set would have cost approximately \$6000.00. What a blessing to have received this gift! Karen has indicated that adding a set of chimes (\$1,285.00) and mallets (\$306.00) to the bell choir would enhance and allow for much richer sounds. Karen has also talked about offering a bell choir program to Green Meadows, which would support our vision of "Connecting in the Spirit."

These additions will cost \$1,285.00 and \$306.00 = \$1,591.00. We are in conversation with the Memorial Gifts Committee to see if they will purchase these items.

We are investing in the future of our church! God is not done with FCC yet. Please pray daily for continued blessings and offer your gifts to help us be a blessing to others and to God.

As we have been discussing, "Connecting in the Spirit" is a vision of transformation and spiritual renewal for the future of our church: through this new ministry vision, we seek to open ourselves to God's leading to build upon what best served our mission in the past, to construct a whole-church ministry which is spiritually relevant in the present, and offers opportunities for growth to carry us into the future.
