See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. Isaiah 43:19

Greetings in the Name of Christ!

I share with you a beautiful Springtime prayer/poem by Joyce Rupp.

O Dancer of Creation, the earth awakens to an urgent call to grow. In the hidden recesses of my wintered spirit I, too, hear the humming of your voice, calling me, wooing my deadness back to life.

My soul yawns, stretches, quickens, as the energy of Spring revives my weariness. I sit with wonder, observing the steady activity of downy woodpeckers and newly yellowed finch. I do so wait with the avid attention of a child's first look, savoring the colors and shapes of earth's loveliness.

As the filtering patterns of early sunlight lift the shades of green in every growing thing, I enter into spring's unlettered words of life. From the Deacons' Bench

Pentecost! The "birth-day" of the Church! Our May 23rd worship was a joyful celebration of the first Pentecost: we danced, we sang out loud accompanied by live music, we welcomed the Holy Spirit into our hearts. I was moved to tears by the blessings of Pastor Pat's message, the live music from Sandy Tilander and Bobbi Schofield and the presence of my sister and brother congregants. I was supercharged by the Spirit, and like Isaiah, my full heart responded, "Here am I; send me!". By Tuesday, I was a bit sad to realize my spirit was already flagging! A recent reflection from Rev. Tabitha Arnold captured my spiritual rollercoaster:

Awe came upon everyone because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. Acts 2:43 (NRSV)

"I wonder how long their wonder lasted. After the first Pentecost, I wonder how long those early Christians could sustain their amazement and awe at God's mighty deeds. The rush of the wind, the tongues of fire, the ability to understand one another in all different languages. It was a wonder-filled day. But then came the next day, and the next week, and the next month...ordinary time filled with ordinary life...So how long did their wonder last? It's hard to sustain wonder. The early Christians knew that as well as we do. So after the first Pentecost, they continued to do all the ordinary things we still do as local churches. Break bread, pray, engage the Word, praise God, care for those in need, and figure out how to share their common life."

I've found that being "supercharged" to live my faith is not sustainable, but keeping a steady charge in my spiritual batteries will continuously generate enough energy to sustain me in willingly carrying out the above tasks of ordinary common congregational life, and just life in general. As uplifting as I find Sunday worship, I've found I need to plug in to the Spirit between Sundays, to keep my charge up. I may read a devotional, or an inspiring article or book, take a quiet moment outside, read Scripture, chat with Pastor Pat, take a role in worship, participate

in Bible Study, and church activities and missions. Volunteer out in the community.

I find the more I try to connect with the Spirit, the more I am energized to live in the Spirit, and even experience brilliant sparks of wonder from time to time. If you find your batteries running low I encourage you to allow more opportunities for spiritual connection, between Sundays. Bible Study may be a safe place to start- you don't have to speak, just sit, listen, be present, and be recharged.


