From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings of Grace and Peace!

We have been busy at church! New and good things are happening already and more are in the works. I hope that as soon as you feel comfortable with the decrease of COVID infections, you will make your way back to join us in worship, in Bible study, choir, bells, small groups ministries, or some other place where you can reconnect. I, along with many others, have missed seeing **YOU!** We pray we will see you soon.

March 2nd will mark the first day of Lent. We will offer two short services to recognize the beginning of the season and receive ashes. Whatever last year was like, Lent calls us to let go of it and to journey inward, listening to God, seeking direction to a new Easter, a new way of life and resurrection for this year. "Letting go" of something in your daily life and putting the time, energy, or money towards something which will draw you closer to God is at the heart of Lent. What will you take up? Some examples are as follows:

Letting go of sleeping in or lounging on Monday and taking up sharing in Spirit Chat. (10-11 AM)

Letting go of eating out and taking up donating the money to a food shelter?

Letting go of a television show or social time and instead taking up reading the Bible or another spiritual book. (Speak to me if you need a suggestion)

Letting go of diving into your meal and taking up giving a prayer of thanksgiving before you eat.

Letting go of noncommitment and taking up being more faithful in word and deeds.

Letting go of idle time and take up serving at a shelter or the church?

Letting go of sleeping in on Sunday mornings and take up attending worship.

Letting go of making excuses and taking up speaking the truth, even to yourself.

If you have any questions about Lent or another subject, I would be happy to speak with you. Not a lecture, just a conversation. Call the office or send me an e-mail. We can meet in the church office, your home, or coffee shop.

During Sunday worship in Lent, we will have a sermon series, "For God's Sake." Many times, we use that phrase in a derogatory sense. I will be preaching on positive ways to become a more inclusive, loving, integrated, and serving community: For God's Sake and ours. There is so much violence in the world that we need to be light and to hold onto the goodness in which we were created. Jesus gives us some difficult challenges in life, but they are challenges that bring healing and connection to others in the long run.

We are having a study (Wednesdays at 10:30 AM-noon) on the *Witness at the Cross*. It is a wonderful study by Professor Amy-Jill Levine. On Jesus' last days he was surrounded by crowds. Many folks were ugly and mean, some were in hiding, others quiet: few were kind and supportive. It is easy to critique the witnesses in our Biblical stories and condemn many of the behaviors. But I think the witnesses also call us to reflect on our dedication and place regarding Jesus. If the arrest and execution of Jesus took place today, where would we find ourselves standing? What would our behavior be? Would we be present or hiding?

Beginning in Lent, *For God's Sake*, the world's and our own, let us deepen our faith and live it out **BOLDLY** in the world.

Music Update



Missions

For well over two decades bringing a food donation for local shelters was as much a part of Sunday worship as tucking our monetary offerings into a pocket or purse before leaving

the house. The adults placed their donations in a designated cabinet, and the children brought theirs into their classrooms for collection, along with their offering envelopes.

As we live into "Connecting in the Spirit" we would like to restore this simple but effective mission outreach practice for the Children's Ministry.

The Children will be collecting food as an ongoing mission for the Community Survival Center of Indian Orchard. Some great protein items that are always needed from their wish list are the following:

- peanut butter
- canned tuna
- hearty soups,

- canned beef stew
- corned beef hash
- canned chicken

Other great items to round out a healthy diet are:

- pasta and sauce
- cereal (hot or cold)
- canned fruits

- canned vegetables
- boxed potatoes

Monetary donations are wonderful as well. Just put in envelope and mark for Survival Center and give to the children when they are collecting the food!

Missions will be making Hope Totes for homeless men, women and children. These bags will be brought to the Springfield Rescue Mission and to be handed out when the homeless families reach out to them, or the Rescue Mission will be delivering lunches in their van! This will run for the month of March and is put together by us, Mission members, and delivered to the Springfield Rescue Mission by the return date of April 10th!
