There will be a Pastor who will provide coverage if there is someone who needs a sick visit, or any type of pastoral care, and coverage for funerals.

# Connecting in the Spirit Update

Since last July, Pastor Pat and 8 members of the Renovation Team, in addition to the Children/Youth Faith Formation Ministry Team, have met frequently, (1-4 times per month each) with and without our professional consultants, Ministry Architects, to build this transformational ministry program.

We'd like to share with you some thoughts which help us in planning for the present, and for the future of our church:

#### • From <u>relevantchildren'sministries.com</u>;

"Any church that wants to exist in the future must reach young families. A healthy church is made up of all generations, just like a family is: kids, teenagers, parents, grandparents, and great grandparents.

But if a church only has grandparents and greatgrandparents it will eventually die as the members die. ...take a risk. Change is always a risk. But the greater risk is to do what you've always done.

If what you're doing now is not reaching young families, then guess what? Nothing is going to change that unless you change what you are doing."

#### • From Pastor Jayson D. Bradley:

"Children's ministry isn't a way to keep kids out of everyone's hair while adults have the "real" worship service. It should be a reflection of the emphasis the church puts on the discipleship of its youngest, most vulnerable members."

#### • From <u>Debbie Swindoll, graftedlife.org:</u>

"When we share spiritual experiences with children, we create a foundation for thriving.... Children need adults who will walk with them in shared relationship with God."

#### • From ministrytech.com:

One of the main things that keeps young families at your church is by helping them connect in meaningful and relational ways to other young families. With some creative thinking, the church will stop asking young families to "come to church" and will instead start taking the church to them.

Research shows us that vital churches have developed a culture which fosters this kind of connection and outreach not just among their families, but among their congregants of every age, and with their neighbors, near and far.
