From the Pastor's Desk

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God."

Philippians 4:6

Greetings of Grace and Peace!

Most of us do not like change, it is part of God's world and plan. As disciples, our understanding of God has changed through history. Through the Bible, we read that God revealed messages to only a few folks, then to more people as prophets, and now our understanding is that God communicates with all of us in a variety of different ways. The very way we live in this world changes each day. Even as we see that change is part of God and our understanding, we struggle with accepting change. Yet, just because we struggle with accepting change, it doesn't mean that God will stop allowing it to happen. Perhaps it is the gift from God to help us grow in our faith and rely on God more fully, as individuals, churches, nations, and collectively as humans.

Here at FCC, we will be experiencing change this upcoming Fall.

After eight (8) years, Marilyn has resigned her position in cleaning and caring for the church as custodian. The aches and pains in her shoulder, coupled with caring for her home and husband, are making continuing impossible. Laura Lillibridge has taken a full-time position in a nearby school district, which will prevent her

from continuing to be in the role of Coordinator for our Children and Youth Faith Formation (CYFF). Mark Jacobson is resigning from his role as Music Director towards the end of September. We are grateful to Marilyn, Laura, and Mark for sharing their gifts with us to enrich our church in a variety of ways. We are sorry to see them resigning from their roles as we are happy, content, and sometimes even excited, with their fulfilling these positions.

We admit that we do not like change. Many times, it is because we become fearful of the "what ifs?" (You can fill in your own response to the what if?) It is so easy to live in fear. However, the Bible tells us not to worry but "seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." (Matt. 6:33) Read entirety of Matthew 6: 25-34. As for myself, and I hope many of you in the church, we will move forward looking and seeking God and what God holds for FCC?

God's promise in Jeremiah 29: 11: For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future is a promise I hold dear in my heart and life. That scripture was the short devotion I chose as I meet with the leaders of FCC in the possibility of my becoming your pastor. I know in my heart that God has called me into ministry. A few years into my ministry at another church, I was descending into a "What if?" state. I recently came across this quotation from pastor and author, Patrick Henry Reardon:

"Suppose for a moment that God began taking from us the many things for which we have failed to give thanks. Which of our limbs and faculties would be left? Would I still have my hands and my mind? And what about loved ones? If God were to take from me all those persons and things for which I have not given thanks, who or what would be left of me?"

The more times I read it, the more I see a lifetime of blessings scrolling across my mind's eye; the scroll is unending as more blessings, small and large, are added every day. Have I even consciously taken stock of a tiny percentage of that unearned stream of gifts? Honestly, have my thanks even equaled my complaints?

I can't help but ask myself: Who am I to be so generously and unconditionally loved by God? To receive so much evidence of God's love? I doubt I'll ever reach the state Paul talks about, but the very least I can do is ask God's help to try.


<u>Happy 100th Birthday</u> <u>Yvonne (Winnie) Godek!</u>



Save the Date- Important Potluck Luncheon & Conversation following worship on October 2nd

Many of you were in worship (in person or on Facebook) on Sunday, August 21 when I spoke about Jesus healing the Bent over Woman (Luke 13:10-17). I spoke about how Jesus broke rules to correct issues and claim justice for the woman who was bent over.

Jesus couldn't wait one more day, one more hour, but now is the time when he would save his people (Luke 4: 19) and Behold, now is "the acceptable time," behold, now is "the day of salvation" (Romans 13:11) As followers of Jesus, we are called to stand up for justice issues, so that those bent over and pushed down can stand up in all areas of life.



To have the realm of Jesus' ways and love, we cannot wait, for **this** is the day! Nor can we be a silent witness! Jesus was the same in private and public, in comfortable settings and those places where others judged him and planned to crucify him.

I spoke about standing with those who are in same sex relationships. Many of you wonder why I brought it up now and why I spoke about it in reference to the United Methodist denomination. To answer, I bring up three points:

1. FCC is combined members of United Church of Christ (UCC), the United Methodist (UMC), and Community members. All three segments have the same basic Christian beliefs regarding God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. We have a common history. We use the same Bible (even though it is interpreted differently). But we have different ways of denominational structure and varying polity for UCC and UMC.

While the UCC does have Regional Conferences and they have suggestions and beliefs that each church might follow and provide procedures to best carry them forward, individual UCC churches are allowed to decide for themselves to take a stand on something or vote to implement a rule and/or procedure. The United Methodist Church's structure is very different. Each church is included in an area conference. The rules that we agree to follow are voted on yearly at the annual conference, which is made up of all clergy from that region/area and an equal number of disciples/members.

Bigger rules that affect all the UM churches in the world are decided up at a General Conference, which is held every four years. Members from each United Methodist Annual Conference across the world elect folks to represent them at the General Conference. They vote and decide what rules to follow and how they are to be implemented. The rules comprise the UM Book of Discipline.

The United Methodist have been arguing for over fifty (50) years whether to be Open and Affirming (UCC language) or Reconciling (UMC). Open and Affirming and Reconciling are different words basically working towards the same goal, where love overcomes judgement and where everyone, regardless, is included. Some of the debatable questions in the UMC are: Should UMC allow persons of LGBTQI to become ordained? Can a pastor marry a same sex couple? Can they use the church building to perform a same sex marriage? Should LGBTQI folks be allowed to join the church? Most votes to these questions have been exclusive at the UM General Conference. Since the higher UCC conferences promote inclusivity, it is up to the individual UCC churches to have those conversations or choose not to.

While community members and UCC individual churches can decide on their own about how they live out God's love to LGBTQI, the UM clergy and members must follow what is voted on by General Conference or by defiance as the New England Annual Conference has done.

2. Many UM churches in the United States want to be reconciling and inclusive of all. However, The UMC is a

global denomination. They have member churches in Africa and Asia, where being in a same sex marriage is against the law. Their voices (and votes) along side more conservative churches in the United States and other areas are opposed to reconciling. They still say that it is incompatible with our Christian teachings. Due to COVID, the General Conference, which meets every four years was cancelled in 2020. They will not meet as a body to change any rules until 2024, eight years or double the normal time since the last GC. Eight years is a long time. Because of the delay and inability to conclude and resolve the decision of reconciling or not, which was already coming to a breaking point between the two positions in the UMC at the prior General Conference, The New England UMC, along with other Annual Conferences throughout The United States, decided they couldn't wait any longer. This previous June (2022) at the Annual Conference, the New England UMC voted to ignore the voice and votes of the General Conference which prohibits marriage ceremonies in the UM churches and punishes Pastors for participating in a same sex ceremony, along with many hurtful statements which are included in our Book of Discipline (the rule book past by the General Conference). They, like Jesus in Luke 13, decided they cannot wait one more day to stand up for justice and move forward truly acknowledging that all are welcome: and that means ALL!

3. Many are asking why am I talking about this now? In the delay of the General Conference as stated above, more conservative members/churches have formed a new church: The Global Methodist Church. They are leaving the denomination of UMC and forming their own body and rules. We talk about it in our church because we have members who are United Methodist. We are connected and concerned for and with each other. The UM members need to share how they feel, where they stand, and what they are going to do. Do they stay part of the UM denomination, or do they want to switch to the Global Church? Not only individuals are leaving, but entire congregations. How the United Methodist members of FCC vote will impact the

body of our church. UM members are forced to decide on this important issue, but we invite all our church body to come along. It is an important decision in our time.

I am extremely proud of FCC for living out a faith that does include others. Many of you have said that you have always been a welcoming church. That is true, regarding the people who walk through the doors. We have folks living, worshipping, and praying with us in that realm. It is a safe place for them to enter and not be told they are sinners (something I, personally, would not preach or live out). However, we now live in a world where many churches have been a loud voice in condemning LGBTQI. It is time we take an official stand. If we are to be welcoming, then we need to let our neighbors and community know that they are truly welcome here and will not be condemned for who they are and how they live that out. If the vote is to be exclusive, then the church needs to claim that. If the UM members decide to leave and join the Global Church, discussion needs to follow as to how their decision will impact the other church members: both UCC and community. This is the day! I hope you will think about how you feel, what questions you might have, and how Jesus would act if he were present with us, before the meeting time arrives. Be prepared to speak calmly and clearly in sharing your thoughts, feelings, questions, and more. Bring your listening ears that we might understand each other or even to understand one another's questions. This is an important issue of our time and for our church. We need your presence to know how and where everyone understands the issue and how we will move forward.
