Another year over, A new one just begun.


And so this is Christmas for weak and for strong, for rich and the poor ones.

Please call (413-566-3711) or email the office (hampdenfederated@gmail.com) to let us know if you and your children will be present so we will know how many ornaments we need.





Family Movie Night
