Scholarship for Children for PA Trip and More

I am glad to share this good news with you. Our church decided to financially support our children for this coming PA trip, April 23-25. The church will fully pay the trip cost for each and every child (\$539/per person). There are some conditions. To receive this financial support, the child should...

- Be a child/grandchild of our member
- Be at the age of 12 and under
- Attend a 4-week special curriculum for Children's Moment and Sunday School with the story of Daniel before the trip (March 17, April 7, 14, and 21)
- Be able to understand the Children's Moment and Sunday School

During this trip, we will see a Biblical show, "Daniel," at the Sight and Sound Theater and have an Amish Country tour. Each night, Jocelyn (CE coordinator) will lead a gathering time for children and their parents in which they will share what they learned and thought about during the day.

Daniel was the one who kept his faith in God from childhood in every situation. And God blessed and used him for His glory. Amish people still keep their faith and teach their children in

Christian faith even in the 21st century. This will be truly a valuable time for Children.

For adult congregations who join the trip, we will also have a gathering time for adults each night if the schedule allows us to do so. We will share what we learned on the day and have a joyful time with fun programs like Bible Trivia. I hope that this trip will give us a life-long memory of joy, faith, and friendship.



### Children's Ministry

FCC has a long history of supporting children's religious education and faith formation. At this time, our congregants are still blessing the children and their families by providing a salary for our Christian Education Coordinator/Lead Teacher, Jocelyn Smith, and by forming a dedicated team of experienced volunteer C.E. Committee members, and teacher assistants.

As in other churches, our Sunday School enrollment has declined over the years: we began Sept., 2023 with 3 children. I have heard wondering from some congregants over recent years if the time and expense invested in the C.E. Program is "worth it" for just a few children. If you were in church this past Sunday, Feb. 25, I believe those concerns were answered!

In leading the Children's Moment, Jocelyn introduced the Bible character Zaccheus. The story of Zaccheus was explored by our core 3 children last Spring, in Sunday School, and they were able to share every detail of the story during the Childrens Moment, demonstrating their understanding of Jesus' motivation in visiting Zaccheus' home, the crowd's reaction, and the transformation in Zaccheus as a result of his encounter with Jesus!

What a testimony to the power of our program! What a testimony to the families, who faithfully bring the children to church, and reinforce their studies at home! What a testimony to the

faithfulness of our congregants, who provide the means of time, money, and loving support to ensure we are living out our **Mission Statement** for the children: "...to create a safe place to know and experience God's love, to learn the stories and ways of Jesus, and to carry faith, hope, and love into the world."

As with adult congregants, the number of participants is not as important as the growth of the spirit within them. However, we are being blessed with growth within our congregation and Sunday School: over the past month, Claire and her dad Justin have joined us on Sunday morning, and Madison has been able to join us more often as well. Claire expressed this wish during a recent class: "I want to become a member of this church!" Doesn't that really say it all?

Amen!
